There is something special about the Capital Region. This community recognizes the needs of others and always steps up to make a difference.

RMHC of the Capital Region entered 2021 with key programs under restrictions due to the worldwide pandemic. We remained committed to meeting the needs of families, and also had a vision to do something unlike ever before.

- Together with our partners at the Bernard & Millie Duker Children's Hospital at Albany Med, we were able to restore services at the Ronald McDonald Family Room and extend the services of the Hospitality Cart to every pediatric unit throughout the hospital.
- Responding to the needs of new preemie parents, RMHC and the NICU at Albany Med developed the Helping Our Preemies Excel (HOPE) program. Families receive a bag filled with essential items like skin lotion, preemie hats/mittens, milestone cards, and much more.
- Recognizing families' needs for nourishment throughout the day, RMHC developed a Love Is Served lunch program, providing healthy sandwiches and snacks for families through the Ronald McDonald Family Room.
- We purchased a carriage house adjacent to 139 S. Lake Avenue to increase space for families at the Ronald McDonald House and enhance operations of the HOPE program, Love is Served, and the ever-growing READ for RMHC-CR program.
- · And, we saw a long-held dream become reality...

Throughout the spring, we worked with dozens of contractors, volunteers, businesses, and past guest families to complete renovations on a law office in Lake George...

Motivated by the desire to give families with seriously ill children a chance to make lasting memories, we worked with RMHC Global to develop a new program...

With generous support from the Village of Lake George, the Krantz family, and more than 40 local businesses who pledged to welcome these families wholeheartedly...

RMHC of the Capital Region opened the first-of-its-kind *Ronald McDonald Family Retreat at Krantz Cottage* on July 14, 2021. We welcomed 17 families from July to December - giving them each 5 days to experience of the love of RMHC and the joy of being together amidst the peace and tranquility of beautiful Lake George.

Thanks to the continued leadership of the Board of Directors, faithful commitment from volunteers, dedication of staff, and the generous compassion of communities across the Capital Region, 2021 was a year of both renewal and growth for RMHC-CR, successfully advancing our mission to care for children and families.
